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### IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE EDITORIAL GROUP

1. Since the start of the pandemic the Leader has been distributed by e-mail to all those on the Parish data base, with paper copies going to the few who do not have internet access.
2. There are a number of advantages to this arrangement:
3. **Speed.** There is no delay for printing and distribution and a team of volunteers is not required for delivery to approximately 260 properties.
4. The **cost** is greatly reduced. Currently we are fortunate to have sponsors for the printing and this is more likely to continue if only a few copies are required.
  - We **restrict the number of pages** to 8 to limit printing costs. With e-mail this is not necessary.
  - We can include **colour photos** in e-mail versions. Printed copies can only be monochrome.
  - It is **better for the environment**. A single print run for the Parish uses over 1000 sheets of paper.

For these reasons we suggest continuing to distribute the Leader by e-mail to all those who find this acceptable. If you do not currently receive a paper copy but would very much prefer to have one please contact Mo Dewar (w), Janet Quinn (q) or Carol Robson (f). **If the number of paper copies increases significantly distribution will only be possible if enough volunteers can be found to deliver them.**

### NEW MEMBERS REQUIRED.

The Editorial Group meets for about an hour every other month primarily to discuss a draft of the next edition of the Leader. Individual members also act as a contact point for their area of the Parish and as a source of information. We invite anyone who is interested in joining us to contact any member of the Group (see back page) who will be happy to answer any questions you may have. Currently we do not have representatives from the Colliery or Longhirst Hall and would particularly welcome interest from these areas.

The Trustees expressed their satisfaction with the redeveloped heating and hot water systems and the new suspended ceiling, lighting, Wi-Fi system and curtains in the large hall, all of which have contributed greatly to the comfort, acoustics, and general ambiance of the place.

## PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



At the meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> September the following items were discussed:  
**Micklewood** - Jon Mills and Janet Quinn reported that they had met with Sean McQuaid of Dere St Homes (developers of Micklewood Close). Mr McQuaid confirmed that they will **not** be creating a path between Longhirst Village and Micklewood.

**Longhirst Hall** - Andy Robson noted there is only one flat remaining unsold on the development. Progress has been made with the work on the properties on Dairy Lane.

**Meeting with the County Council Leadership** - Councillors accepted the offer for a member of NCC Cabinet to attend a Parish Council meeting and agreed the most pressing issue was to maintain the special character of the Village, to integrate residents from Longhirst Hall and Micklewood, whilst protecting the Village from further development. (We have subsequently been notified that the Deputy Leader, Cllr Richard Wearmouth, will attend our next meeting on 4<sup>th</sup> November at 7pm).

**Longhirst Wildlife Project** - This will be community led. At present Peter Coates is the lead on this project and it is intended to hold a public meeting in the near future. Chris Marr and Peter Coates were meeting the Woodland trust to discuss the possible extension of the Millennium Wood into Domino's Field in the next few days.

**Public Rights of Way** - the rights of way survey undertaken by Jon Mills, Jenny Ames and Dave Wiggett has been given to the County Council who have agreed a meeting to discuss the priorities for improvements to the paths.

**Potland Park update** - Glen Fahy reported that the majority of work is completed, but the bridle paths and fencing require alterations and work appears to have stalled.

As Covid restrictions have eased a number of **Village Hall activities** have successfully restarted including the Luncheon Club, Coffee Mornings and Pub Nights.

**The Cricket Club** facilities are open to anyone, including non - members.

With the support of County Councillor David Towns the **Tennis Club** has secured funding from the County Council towards the replacement of three of their courts.

Northumberland County Council will be approached to ask for a mechanical sweeper to clear the **overgrown pavements** leading into the Village.

The **next meeting** of the Parish Council will be on **Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> November** at 7pm in the Village Hall. All residents are invited to attend.

## COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S COLUMN



The year seems to be passing very quickly - and what a year it has been so far. I've continued to be amazed by the work of local NHS staff and volunteers in delivering a world-class Covid vaccination programme right here in Northumberland and, as I write, the effects of this are clear to be seen. Whilst life will of course never return to "normal" for a lot of residents, we can all be very proud of what has been achieved locally to deal with the pandemic and to support each other through what have been very difficult times.

As the economy opened up over the summer, Northumberland experienced a huge influx of visitors and tourists. Whilst excellent for the local economy, this did lead to a number of issues with increased littering, disrespectful parking and speeding in the area. On the latter, I have been contacted by Northumbria Police over concerns about speeding through Longhirst village and I am continuing to work with them and the Parish Council to find solutions. However, the County and Parish Councils can only set the right circumstances to reduce speeding - we have recently worked together to design and implement a speed reduction scheme involving the 40mph buffer zone starting shortly after the Whorral Bank roundabout, clearer signage and road markings and speed indicator signs. Sadly, we cannot prevent drivers from wilfully ignoring speed limits and warning signs, and I have asked Northumbria Police to deploy extra resources in the Village to enforce the speed limits already in place. I have also asked Highways for a speed survey and I will share the results of that with the Parish Council and with residents once received.

I am also aware of the issues with some of the drains in the Village, and these have been attended to by the Council's gullies cleaner, with mixed results. I have asked that the drains are cleaned more regularly but please do let me know if you spot a backed-up drain which requires attention, as it is in everyone's interests that these are treated as soon as possible. I also continue to see what can be done about the path alongside Butcher's Lane. Unfortunately, there is no "quick fix" solution to this, but it is a top-priority for me and for the Parish Councils in both Longhirst and Pegswood.

I have recently supported both the Cricket Club and the Tennis Club at Longhirst Hall with assistance and funding towards their exciting development and growth plans - I would urge all residents to use and enjoy these facilities. The club house building is a large and welcoming facility and the clubs are working hard to put on interesting and fun events, the profits from which are all reinvested in the site. It is a very impressive facility and one we're lucky to have locally.

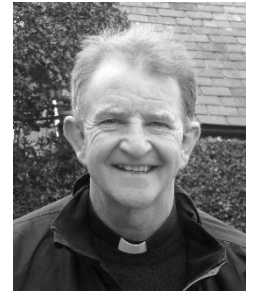

## VICAR'S LETTER

### PARISH ENVIRONMENTAL CHAMPION

Newcastle Diocese is recommending that every church in the diocese nominates an individual as their "Environmental Champion". The role is to promote green issues and sustainability in the practical context of the parish and church. Some of the activities may include:

- Working towards becoming a carbon neutral church and parish
- Environmental campaigning and action
- Raising awareness of issues such as low-carbon travel, recycling, and biodiversity
- Encouraging and promoting lifestyle changes
- Cutting energy and carbon, water use and waste
- Caring for wildlife and ecology in the churchyard and other places



The Parish Environmental Champion should be interested in the environment, be enthusiastic about the role and help the St. John's Longhirst Parochial Church Council (PCC) to adopt an environmental policy, in line with the policy of the Newcastle Diocese. If this takes off maybe a group of volunteers could form an environmental group and work with the PCC to set some achievable goals? There are lots of tools and resources available through the environment webpages of the Newcastle Diocesan website and the Church of England Environment Programme.

### ADVENT TOY SERVICE

**Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> November** is Advent Sunday and at St. John's Church, Longhirst we are intending to hold our annual Toy Service at 2pm.

As you may remember, last year we were unable to hold a Toy Service but parishioners were nevertheless very generous in contributing to a toy collection. All being well we intend to hold a service this year and for all who attend it is a wonderful way of anticipating Christmas through the singing of Advent Carols and blessing the Advent Ring. Children are especially welcome and we traditionally get a good turn out from the young peoples' uniformed organisations with their banners.

We have done this for many years now but for newcomers to the Parish who may not have attended before, the idea is very simple. Worshippers bring a wrapped Christmas present indicating on it whether it is suitable for a boy or girl and an approximate age. Presents for teenagers are also welcome.

During the service the presents are placed at the front of the Church and are later taken to North Shields where they are given to the Cedarwood Trust, a Church of England community outreach organisation, for distribution among less well off families in the Meadow Well area. This helps some children to have a much happier Christmas than they might otherwise have expected.

In past years it has been an enjoyable occasion for all and I look forward to seeing you.
