By the time this issue of the Longhirst Leader goes out, the Reading Room will be back in operation but we will have to wait a few weeks for the curtains to be chosen, made and fitted.

The Photo-voltaic cells have now been installed on the rear roof and are already generating some of our electricity. One of the battery packs has failed but this will soon be replaced and we should be able to keep the Hall warm and lit for at least a few days in the event of a power failure.



The Fresh Air Ventilation System will have to wait until next August but concerns we had about the eventual cost due to inflation have been greatly reduced due to a further award of funds from the National Lottery.

It is with great sadness that we report the death of Betty Potts in November. She was a well-known resident of the Village having lived here for nearly 70 years. She will be greatly missed by her friends and family.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



The meeting held on 3 November was attended by three residents from Lawson Villas who raised the issue of the "hole in the wall" leading onto Dairy Lane. The construction of the new houses is now complete and the hole is overdue for closure. The Clerk will contact NCC to chase this up. They also reported that the **Residents Management Committee** was up and running and that four meetings with Kingston Developments had

taken place. Jon Mills commented that the Micklewood residents' shares had not yet been transferred and consequently their Management Committee has still been unable to meet.

PCSO Potts, from Northumbria Police, has advised that if anyone is struggling with the cost of living then a **subsidised grocery purchase scheme** is available at Stobhill Community Centre in Morpeth.

Our County Councillor was unable to attend the meeting but reported that he was pressing for action by NCC on the **Ashington Road flooding site** and the obstructed **Rights of Way at Potland Park**.

It was noted that the threatened road closures by **Network Rail** at the crossing had proved to be less of a problem than they had led us to expect.

Peter Coates thanked the Council members and all the residents who attended the Planning Inspector's Enquiry at Morpeth Town Hall to consider the developer's appeal against NCC's refusal of the planning application for five houses in **Domino's Field**. At the time of writing the outcome is still awaited and any news will be circulated immediately.

A resident of Longhirst Hall has used the Freedom of Information Act to obtain a copy of the Conservation Officer's report recommending refusal of the planning application for an extension to **The Old Pavilion**. (NCC planners refused to provide a copy when requested to do so by the Parish Council). The application has been withdrawn.

The Parish Council requested that N.B. Clark hold a public meeting to explain their proposals for a recycling plant at the former **Butterwell Disposal Point** on the Linton Road. N.B. Clark have subsequently agreed to this and details are given on the front page.

At the meeting it was agreed to raise the lack of action by NCC (as highway authority) and Advance Northumberland (as landowner) to prevent **flooding of the Ashington Road** at the forthcoming NCC Castle Morpeth Area Committee meeting. Subsequently the ditch has been cleared so the item was withdrawn from the agenda for the time being.

Richard Tordoff reported that the **footpath** on the main road along the front of the cricket pitch at Longhirst Hall has at last been **cleared** by NCC Highways. The news was warmly welcomed!

The **next meeting** will be held at 7pm on **Thursday 5 January** in the Village Hall and all residents are welcome to attend.

VICAR'S LETTER



The most popular bible reading chosen by wedding couples for their church wedding is St. Paul's "Hymn of Love". Many of you will be familiar with it.

"If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels but do not have love, I am but a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal ... if I give away all I possess ... but do not have love, I gain nothing ... love is patient, love is kind. Love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude ... it does not insist on its own way and is neither irritable nor

resentful ... love hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends ... now faith, hope and love abide these three; and the greatest of these is love."

These striking verses lay out the contours of holiness through the high hopes and ideals they express for our relationships with one another which accounts for their popularity among couples in celebrating their big day. Here however, is a Christmas version of St. Paul's "Hymn of Love" to help us look forward to celebrating Christ's birth and guide us safely through the weeks ahead.

"If I decorate my house with beautiful bows, strands of twinkling lights and shiny baubles, but do not show love to my family, I am just another decorator. If I slave away in the kitchen, baking dozens of mince pies, roasting a perfect turkey, and lay a magnificent table, but have no love for my guests, I am just another cook. If I work at the food bank or sing carols in the hospital and give all that I have to charity but do not have compassion in my heart for those in need, it profits me nothing. If I decorate the tree with shimmering angels and crocheted snowflakes and attend any number of parties but do not remember the birth of Christ, I have missed the point.

Love stops cooking to hug the child. Love sets the tree decoration on one side to give a hand with the washing up. Love puts the Christmas present shopping on hold to run an elderly neighbour to the doctor. Love is kind, though harried and tired. Love does not envy another's home that has more expensive presents or even coordinated Christmas china and table linen. Love doesn't yell at the children to get out of the way but is glad they are there to be in the way. Love doesn't only give to those who can give in return but rejoices in giving to those who can't.

Love bears all things, even irritating relatives. It believes all things and encourages teenagers to aim high for their future. It hopes all things, endures all things, even a family member who is depressed about their job prospects and the cost of living crisis. Love never fails other people. Computer games will crash, even cashmere jumpers will wear out and golf clubs will get lost. But the gift of love will endure forever."
