### **REMEMBERING CAROL ROBSON**

On Sunday 24 November, friends and family came together in St John's Church to celebrate the life of Carol Robson who had played such a big part in the Longhirst community. The service was taken by our former curate, Lee Cleminson, now vicar of Percy Main.



Carol was born in North Shields, second child to Glen and Flo and younger sister to Michael. She had a happy childhood, especially enjoying family outings on bicycles, Carol riding on the back of a tandem. As a family they always had dogs and cats and Carol continued this love of animals throughout her life.

During the war she and the family lived in a wooden shack next to where Rose Cottage is now and she attended school in Longhirst. Later they camped in the garden during the summer.

After leaving school in North Shields, she worked in a factory on the quayside before going to university in Leeds to train as a social worker.

Having been a Girl Guide in her youth Carol went on

to be a Guider and went abroad several times with her Guide friends.

When she retired she knocked down the wooden shack in the garden of Rose Cottage and lived for several years in a porta-cabin until she eventually had her bungalow built.

She dedicated her life to her family, friends, pets, wildlife, village community and the church. She was a member of the Village Hall Committee, the church PCC, the Longhirst Leader editorial group and the Open Gardens organising group. She was a regular visitor to the elderly and housebound and also was involved in the Association for the Deaf. Carol's mother, Flo, lived to a grand old age and spent her final years between North Shields and Longhirst.

Carol was a founder member of Longhirst's children's activity club and especially enjoyed cooking with the children. Since the inception of the Wednesday luncheon club, she was famous for producing many varied and delicious meals.

Carol looked forward to her annual holidays in the wilds of Scotland with her friends and inevitably with her dogs. Until her illness struck, she was remarkably fit, walking Max, her dog, ever y morning in the dunes and on the beach at Druridge Bay.

Carol will be greatly and sadly missed.
