PARISH COUNCIL REPORT



The annual meetings of the Parish Council were held on 4 May and in my **Annual Report** I highlighted the successful outcome of the Domino's Field planning appeal, the creation of the Wildlife and Community Trust (including the award of a £10,000 Heritage Lottery grant), another very successful Open Gardens Weekend and the well attended public meeting held to discuss the proposals for the re-use of the Butterwell Disposal Point.

I also mentioned the marking of the 20th anniversary of the formation of the Longhirst Litter Pickers and their starring role on the front page of the Morpeth Herald! I am very grateful to everyone who has already stepped forward, but we still need more volunteers willing to take on a number of tasks that preserve the highly attractive rural Parish in which we live and to organise events that help to bring our community together. My thanks go to the other members of the Parish Council for their continued support and in particular to our Clerk, Helyn Douglas, for everything she so ably does on our behalf.

Peter Lovering is standing down from the Council as he is moving to Morpeth and was warmly thanked for his contribution. This creates a **vacancy for a new member**. The current Chair and Vice Chair (myself and Chris Marr) were re-elected.

In other business it was reported that a contractor from Amble has finally been appointed to undertake the **repairs to the lychgate** at St. John's Church (work is programmed to start in late May) and the "**hole in the wall**" through to Longhirst Hall from Dairy Lane had been repaired.

Members were very concerned when Glen Fahy described recent cases of extensive **poaching on the former Potland opencast** land with carcasses of swans, geese and ducks being abandoned beside the various ponds.

The Local Government Boundary Commission's proposals to revise the NCC ward boundaries and move Longhirst from the existing "Pegswood" ward to a new "Longhirst" one including ourselves, Hebron and Ulgham were broadly welcomed and the Parish Council will respond accordingly.

Completion of the work is promised by Friday 25 August at the latest. It will be good to have this long running project complete.

VICAR'S LETTER



Introducing our new Bishop of Newcastle

On 22 April I was delighted to have been present at a service of welcome for the Right Reverend Helen-Ann Hartley upon her installation as the 13th Bishop of Newcastle in St. Nicholas' Cathedral in Newcastle. She succeeds the Right Reverend Christine Hardman who retired as Bishop of Newcastle in November last year.

Helen-Ann was born in Edinburgh and spent her early years living

in the Scottish Borders, where her father was a Church of Scotland minister. At a very young age, she moved with her family to Sunderland where she attended primary and secondary school, after her father transferred to priesthood in the Church of England. Helen-Ann read theology at the University of St. Andrews and later undertook New Testament postgraduate studies at Princeton Theological Seminary and Worcester College, Oxford



She was ordained into the Church of England in 2005 as deacon in the Diocese of Oxford, and was ordained priest a year later. In 2010, Helen-Ann relocated to New Zealand where, in 2013, she was elected to become the Bishop of Waikato on the country's North Island. In 2017, she returned to the UK having been appointed Bishop of Ripon. She was awarded an honorary doctorate in education by Sunderland University in 2019 and is an honorary fellow of both Worcester and Harris Manchester Colleges, Oxford.

It was at Oxford that she met her husband, Dr. Myles Hartley, who is an organist and musician. Myles and Helen-Ann both enjoy the outdoors and Helen-Ann is a keen runner and particularly enjoys "parkrun". She is also active in the world of media.

Upon hearing of her appointment Bishop Helen-Ann said: "I am absolutely delighted and excited to be the next Bishop of Newcastle. With life-long connections to the whole region covered by the Diocese, I am inspired by the example of the Northern Saints, whose engagement in God's mission lies deep in the fabric and contours of the land. I am, and will continue to be in this new role, a passionate advocate for the region. I look forward immensely to supporting and encouraging the vital work of the Diocese at every level: parishes and benefices, schools, chaplaincies, clergy and lay together as we continue to engage in God's mission."
